

Other cavities also are found among those with the asci; these contain very minute oval spores divided by cross partitions into three parts, and borne on slender stalks. These are called stylospores, the use of which is not known, but they are generally believed to be concerned in the perpetuation of the species. Stil other cavities exist containing slender filaments (spermatia) which also seem to be concerned in reproduction. Besides the cavities referred to, sometimes spaces more flattened than these and in some cases showing a triangular form appear; they are lined with in Canada, and applications are also short, delicate filaments that end in a minute oval body.
