of electric power. A firm in Lauffen, on the  
Rhine, will furnish currents of 500-horse  
power over copper wires from a station 140  
miles from the exhibition.

Emperor William of Germany has bought...  
estate near Metz, it is supposed for  
political reasons. He wished to show the  
princes of the annexed provinces that he  
regarded them, and to make it fashionable  
among old German families to own places in  
the district.

During 1889 no fewer than 920 new news...  
papers were started in France, of which not  
more than 500 remain in life. On the other hand, the  
oldest journals claim a circulation of  
1,000,000 copies daily. During the same  
period there were printed in France more  
than 15,000 new books, including 5000 new  
periodicals.

An unknown man has been found at...  
Ludwigsfeld, in Germany, shot dead. Upon  
his breast was pinned a letter, containing  
these words:—"Bury me with the other  
unknowns." The wounds upon the body  
clearly indicated that he had committed  
suicide, but his face was so mutilated by  
bullet shots that identification was impossible.

A Vienna correspondent telegraphs that...  
the Vienna Assize Court sentence of death  
has been pronounced upon a woman who had  
poisoned her husband by putting phosphor  
into his food. Her object was to marry  
another man. She simulated madness throu...  
out the trial, and continued to smile while  
the sentence of death was being pronoun...  
ced.

A trial has been made at Civita Vecchia...  
of a nautical ball invented by Signor Bal...  
mello. It is seven feet in diameter, and  
can hold four persons. When closed it sink...  
s, and is steered and propelled under water  
by rudder and screw. It has windows and  
cannons, and, besides fishing up things, it  
may be used for destructive purposes in  
time of war.

The first execution in Strasburg since 1870...  
took place on Monday, when Michael Ems...  
was executed for the death penalty for havin...  
murdered a servant named Sophie Muller. The  
guiltine was not used, but the murderer,  
who was not even bound, laid his head on a  
wooden bench, and with one blow was dec...  
apitated by an executioner, who used a  
two-handed sword for the purpose.

Two strange suicides took place almost...  
simultaneously in Paris on Sunday. Mr.  
Lambert Halphen, the secretary of Count  
Lamondo, blew his brains out, while John  
Pitt, who was the Count's favourite jockey,  
committed suicide in the same way. Mr.  
Halphen's rash act was due to money losses  
at the Bourse, whilst Pitt's motive appear...  
to have been a disappointment in love.

A Dublin telegram from Buda Pesth states...  
that a man calling himself Dantes, famous  
as a circus fire-eater, died while giving one  
of his performances. It appears that by the  
use of an electric current he was enabled  
apparently to expectorate fire and to breathe  
flames, but in consequence of the current be...  
ing too strong he was unable to respire, and  
died at a blood vessel in attempting to do so.

In the district of Sheing Teh, Canton...  
there are various societies of young women  
devoted to celibacy, known for example as  
"All Pure Sisterhood" or the "Never-To-  
be-Married Sisterhood." A member of one  
of them was on the verge of being compelled  
to break the rules of her society by marriage,  
and in order to prevent it, the entire band,  
of 60 girls included, went and drowned them...  
selves.

A phenomenon is reported from Tetharadz...  
in Hungary, where an aerolith of 80  
pounds weight is said to have fallen with  
such force that it opened a spring of water  
in the earth. As the neighborhood was bad...  
ly supplied with water the inhabitants are  
glad of the occurrence as providential.  
The aerolith has been bought for £200 by an  
Anglo-Australian, who has a collection of  
such things, and who happened to be the  
guest of Count Harmancourt, whose seat is  
near Tetharadz.

In consequence of the approach of the...  
national holiday, an unusual number of mar...  
riages took place in Paris on Saturday  
among the working classes. At the Mairie  
of the Eleventh Arrondissement—an east...  
district densely populated—no fewer  
than fifty-seven couples were united in wed...  
lock, the mayor devoting himself to this  
work without interruption from ten o'clock  
in the morning until half-past one in the  
afternoon. This feat is described by the  
officials of the Mairie as "marriage by  
steam."

A pack of hyenas is reported by the In...  
can papers to have made its appearance near  
Longberg. The animals are said to be prow...  
ling about at dead of night and making  
great depreations among men and animals.  
The night recently a child of about two  
years of age was carried away by one of  
them. In the morning the head and two  
hands were found, to the great surprise  
and terror of the inhabitants. Two other  
children are said previously to have met the  
same fate; many dogs and goats have also  
been victims to the hyenas.

The big medical men of Vienna have just...  
been thrown into a panic by the discovery  
that for sixteen months they have been  
allowing a young dry goods clerk to treat  
patients in the large city hospital. The  
clerk's name is Patrone. He got his posi...

that almost hangs over the chasm through  
which the Ottawa river runs after falling  
over the Chaudiere. He barricaded the  
door. His assailants attempted to better  
it down, and they kept up the fusillade from  
11.30 till 2 o'clock on Saturday morning.  
It then looked as if they would batter the  
door in. Burns believed if they succeeded  
in getting into the hut that they would kill  
him. He therefore took chances, and crawled  
out of a window overlooking the cauldron,  
and got a footing on about two inches of the  
flooring of the hut that projected beyond  
the side. He sidled along until he reached  
a fence, and by means of this he gained the  
iron bridge, and took refuge from his per...  
secutors in Hull. The route by which he  
escaped makes one dizzy to even look at.  
Warrants are out for the arrest of Delorme  
and Moreau.
