The results of the engagements of Thursday and Friday followed by the severe fighting of Saturday appear to have been more important than was first anticipated. If our men were roughly used the Egyptians were badly cut up and then rout was complete. The enemy fled in disorder, throwing away their arms and accoutrements. Sir Garnet Wolseley is determined to give the enemy no time to recover from his reserves. He will divide his force, leaving a brigade under General Graham to invest Arabi's stronghold at Tel-el-Kebir, and will himself advance with the main body of his army upon Cairo.
