GLENELG COUNCIL

The council met at the Townhall, Aug. 5. All the members were present. Communications from Artemesia and Egremont respecting grants to town lines were read. The following accounts were passed: J. Rutherford, printing \$23 00 C. W. Rutledge, printing 21 00 S. H. McKettrick, road repairs 28 75 R. Bull, funeral expenses - McPadye and W. Kins 16 75 Freight on Road scrape 2 55 The offer of the solicitor of Moses Leslie and John Saunders in the matter of compensation for roadway taken by township was accepted, viz: \$180 for roadway on lots 16 and 166, con. 3, W. T. McCall R., and \$100 for roadway on lot 22, con. 11. Deeds to be free from all incumbrances and according to a plan made by W. R. Northcough, P.L.S., and bearing date Aug. 13, 1882. \$20 was granted for Egremont town line between lots 15 & 20; and \$10 at con. 1 and 24 being equivalent to the Egremont grants. \$40 was granted for Artemesia town line opposite ward 2 Gleneig being equivalent to Artemesia grant. The reeve and road commissioners were appointed to examine bridges, and make the necessary repairs. The treasurer was authorized to accept \$32 16 being in full of arrears of taxes lot con. 3, E. G. R. The following collectors were appointed: Ward 1, Robt. Moffat; W. H. Arrowsmith; 2, T. Cook; 4, John... Total rates levied on the... exclusive of school rates. Council adjourned 11 Oct. 2.

The Game Laws.

Game pheasants and partridge shall not be taken between 1st Jan. & 1st Oct. Snipe shall not be taken between 1st Jan. & 15th Aug. Mallard, grey duck, black duck, wood or summer duck shall not be hunted between 1st Jan. & 15th Aug. The eggs of any of the above mentioned birds are not to be taken. No batteries, sunken pits or night lights shall be used for taking any game, geese, or ducks at any time. No traps or nets shall be set for the purpose of taking game birds at any time. Hares shall not be taken between the 1st March and 1st Sept. Deer shall not be taken between the 15th Dec. and 1st Oct.
