The following is a copy of the new Fishery Act introduced into the Legislature by the Hon. Mr. Hardy.  
Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Councils in this behalf assembled, enacts as follows:

Section 1. No person shall take or catch or kill or carry away a greater number than thirty speckled or brook trout, on any one day, or more speckled or brook trout than the aggregate weight more than fifteen pounds, on any one day.  
Section 2. No person shall retain or carry away any speckled or brook trout of less than five inches in length, but when any speckled or brook trout is taken or caught the same shall be forthwith returned to the water by the person taking or catching the same, without unnecessary injury.

Section 3. No person shall at any time fish for, catch or kill speckled or brook trout, bass or any kind, pickerel, dore, muskellunge or muskellunge, by any means, other than by angling with hook and line in any inland waters.

Section 7. Section 8. One half of any fine or penalty imposed by virtue of this Act shall belong to His Majesty, and may be devoted to carrying out the provisions of this Act, and the other half thereof when collected shall be paid for to the prosecutor or informer, together with any charges which may have incurred and which may be collected.

The New Fishery Act.  
The following is a copy of the new Fishery Act introduced into the Legislature by the Hon. Mr. Hardy.  
Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Councils in this behalf assembled, enacts as follows:

Section 1. No person shall take or catch or kill or carry away a greater number than thirty speckled or brook trout, on any one day, or more speckled or brook trout than the aggregate weight more than fifteen pounds, on any one day.  
Section 2. No person shall retain or carry away any speckled or brook trout of less than five inches in length, but when any speckled or brook trout is taken or caught the same shall be forthwith returned to the water by the person taking or catching the same, without unnecessary injury.

Section 3. No person shall at any time fish for, catch or kill speckled or brook trout, bass or any kind, pickerel, dore, muskellunge or muskellunge, by any means, other than by angling with hook and line in any inland waters.

Section 7. Section 8. One half of any fine or penalty imposed by virtue of this Act shall belong to His Majesty, and may be devoted to carrying out the provisions of this Act, and the other half thereof when collected shall be paid for to the prosecutor or informer, together with any charges which may have incurred and which may be collected.

Section 9. All materials, implements and apparatus and all fish had or taken in contravention of this Act or any regulation made thereunder, may be seized and consigned to Her Majesty for the use of the Government by any fishery, or taken of or from any other person for delivery to any magistrate or justice of the peace, and the proceeds thereof may be applied to defraying the expenses incurred under this Act.

Section 10. This Act shall come into force on the first day of May next.
