Holland Council. Holland Centre, July 9, '92. The Holland Council met at Holland Centre on July 9 for the transaction of township business.

The following were then read: Communications from S. H. Breese re assessment; from J. A. Wilson re assessment; from L. B. Lucas re deviation on lot 30, con. 7; G. B. Holmes asking for grant of \$20 to assist the Central Agricultural Society; from County Treasurer...

Shute—Murray—That the prayer of the petition of C. Price and 22 others be granted by allowing Mr. Hampton to build a bridge as cheaply as possible—carried.

Willis—Shute—That the prayer of the petition of J. H. Featherston and 12 others be granted by expending \$15 on the extension of 60 sideroad, con. 3 and 4—carried.

Shute—Murray—That the Clerk write to the Crown Lands Department in regard to the Lynch deviation, and that he also look up all documents and papers in regard to the same, if there be any such in his possession—carried.

Hampton—Shute—That a grant of \$10 to the Central at Waters Falls, providing Euphrasia, St. Vincent and Sydenham grant an equivalent to that amount—carried.

Hampton—Shute—That this council grant \$20, an equivalent to that granted by Glencly council to be expended on the township, and that we grant \$20 to be expended on deviation on townline Holland and Glencly, providing Glencly grant an equivalent to that amount—carried.

Hampton—Murray—That the bill of the Clerk for postage, express and stationery amounting to \$5.66 be paid—carried.

Murray—Hampton—That the Clerk get an order for \$40, salary for second quarter 1892—carried.

Hampton—Willis—That this council grant \$20 to expend on Garafra road near Conger's old store, providing Sullivan grant a similar amount—carried.

Willis—Hampton—That this council grant \$30 to be expended on townline Holland and Euphrasia, providing Euphrasia grant a similar amount—carried.

Willis—Shute—That this council give Mr. Murray authority to sell the timber on sideroad 12 and 13, con. 11, and expend the proceeds on the road—carried.
