The direct influence of sunshine on the circulation, in paralysis, insomnia, nervous disorders and internal disorders is beginning to be known and acknowledged.

If I wanted to restore a withered arm, a palsied or rheumatic limb, or to bring a case of nervous prostration up rapidly, the most efficient part of the treatment would be to expose the limb or person as much as possible to direct sunlight as the day would afford.
