The result of Tuesday's election appears uncertain. Since Sir Oliver Mowat seems to have a majority, the Minister's report gives 45 Liberals, 28 Conservatives and 20 Patrons. In that case the Patrons' roll will be the balance of power. It is likely, however, that the present Government will be able to hold the reins. The return are not sufficiently complete as yet to press (Wednesday 3 p.m.) to speak with certainty even in regard to our own county. In South Grey McNeil, the Patron, is elected by a large majority over McKechnie, the Liberal. In the North Channel is elected and in East Grey (Camey) Patron, is reported at the head of the poll with several places yet to hear from.
