Week's Commercial Summary.

The banks of Toronto have decided to reduce the rate of interest on deposits from 8 1/2 to 8 per cent, which will go into effect shortly.

The number of failures in the Dominion for the week ending Dec. 18, 1914, was 10, as compared with 12 for the same week last year. All were for small amounts, and few had any assets.

Very few all-cotton goods have reduced the rate of interest on deposits from 8 1/2 to 8 per cent. This is deemed a necessity owing to the large accumulation of money in the banks and the consequent rise in the general price level.

According to the London Mail and Express the only comparison to be found in the present level of the price of cotton is by going back exactly forty years, when the price of middling upland cotton was 12 1/2 cents. The difference was then due to financial and political disturbances—the present cause of over-production and machinery for production.

Owing to the higher prices of wheat in Britain, holders here are not inclined to sell their wheat for export. The same reason is not so strong for holders in the United States. White wheat is selling at 88¢, and No. 1 Manitoba at 86¢. The highest prices for wheat are in the United States, where the highest prices for several months.
