Week's Commercial Summary.

A general break in wheat occurred early last week, culminating Tuesday with a new record for May wheat, which down to 57 at New York. Option trading amounted to 11,000,000 bushels on that day, which was nearly equal to any two-day days this year.

Commercial paper falling due on the 4th was fairly active, about the usual percentage asking for steamship. The most trying months will be March and April, but even in these months the amount of paper due will be comparable to that of May. The indications assumed by the retail trade, however, are probably less than for some years past, and indications are that the financial disasters for the coming two months will not exceed any unusual ripples.

The market closed last week 52 dollars in the morning, about as against 54 the previous week, and 50 for the corresponding week of a year ago. Ontario had 8 more than all the other provinces, of which, though, were of financial value. Quebec had 11 dollars; one was rated at 50 cents under \$1,000, and the others had no credit or bank rating. Nova Scotia had two, New Brunswick one. Manitoba three, British Columbia five. None reported from Prince Edward Island.

The commercial situation in Ontario is unchanged. The same storms have been followed by no weather change, but so severe in many localities that the business has been somewhat impeded thereby. These interests are also suffering by the intense activity in political circles, which have led to a feeling that elections are drawing near.

The Good Friday Convocation adjourned Saturday. Resolutions were passed providing for the method to be adopted in furthering the objects of the association at the next session of the Legislature.

Trinity College School, Port Hope, was destroyed by fire shortly before midday on Saturday. All the records were lost, and it is thought the school would be able to adapt its premises to the circumstances.

As it is, trustees have issued orders for only small set-up parcels and prices generally unchanged.
