Markdale ratenayers are asked to record their vote on Monday next, for or against a By-law for the issuing of debentures for the purpose of raising one thousand dollars with which to purchase and improve a public cemetery. The period for the payment of the debentures has been put at ten years, as per by-law recently passed, making it entirely impracticable under ordinary management for the ratenayers to be called upon to pay anything towards this much needed institution, as the by-law will in all probability not only pay back the amount, but meet all expenses in connection with erecting etc., and afford a handsome profit.
