The world's visible supply of wheat decreased over 8,000,000 bushels the past week. Dealers in Toronto are buying 25 cents per bushel for flour.

There is very little small fruit being received in Toronto, and prices are exceptionally high for this season of the year.

The French crop of wheat, it is estimated, will be 42,000,000 bushels less than in 1894.

The yield of wheat in Canada and United States decreased 1,220,000 bushels the past week. The total is 41,287,000 bushels against 43,154,000 a year ago and 49,825,000 two years ago.
