THE WEEK'S COMMERCIAL SUMMARY.

The gold reserve of the United States treasury is now \$30,601,000.

It is said that the final estimate of what by the United States Government will be lost in bushels.

The return of stock received at the Troycroft cattle market last week was 2,000 cattle, 2,882 sheep, 6,083, and hogs, 2,027.

An active trade is reported in nearly all departments of wholesale merchandise at Toronto. The city is crowded with men engaged for extra of the contract for supplies to the old Dominion Steamship Dredge.

Prof. Saunders, of the experimental farm, who has returned from his trip west, says the Manitoba crop is, if anything, the most abundant and most promising. The business sentiment is better, at present, than for some years past, and indications favor a good autumn trade all round.

The wheat crop is coming forward in fair condition, and there is every reason to expect a yield of at least 50,000,000 bushels. This quantity, with the surplus carried over, places the market in a position of a panic or acute shortage, although no one has made efforts in this direction with less reason. The recent decline brought foreign buyers into the market, and the volume of exports at Atchison, Kansas, on Sept. 20th, was 3,000 bushels, or 1,000 bushels on Wed-

nesday of last week.

According to our commercial sources for the week the trade situation in the United States does not look much like a panic, but rather a continuation of the existing market, by increasing account from the quarter.

In the South there has been a pronounced improvement, while in the central West the market is rather quiet, but while prices are reported as generally prevail ing, in the South the autumn trade is coming up very favorably, and the dredging work is progressing well.

Trade business is generally improving, and a feeling of increased confidence is apparent. An improvement is reported in the iron and hardware trade.

In the Old States the commercial bureaus for the week are giving 18,185,219 for the corresponding week of last year.
