New York, Feb. 2.—The Sun's London correspondent cables:—No ruler of a country in recent years has offered such a pitiable spectacle as that made by Prince Ferdinand on his visit to the Pope this week. The Prince went to Rome almost in disguise, and, like a lugitive, stonped at the Hotel de Lonires, under the name of the Duke of Saxe. On the day of his arrival, at lusk, accompanied by his secretary, both in civil dress, he drove to the Vatcan in a hired carriage. No preparations were made for his reception. There were no Swiss or noble guards, none of the gentlemen of the Papal court, nothing of the gorgeous ceremonial with which even geople of less cank are usually received. It was not Prince Ferdinand of Bulgards, nor the Duke of Saxe, but simple Count Murzani that was received. Signor Pio Centra, the private valet of the Pope, atroduced him, and the audience lasted forty minutes. It is said that the Pope repeated that he could not approve of the conversion of Prince Boris, but would remain passive to please the Cara.
