Pledged to Remedial Legislation. "This Government will go to the country pledged to the principle of remedial legislation." So said Sir Charles Tupper on Wednesday night has. Precursing this sentence had come an announcement from the leader of the House, that the Remedial bill would be withdrawn "for the present." "Constant and determined obstruction," said Sir Charles, "has shown the Government that, with the limited time remaining at our disposal, it is impossible to donduct the bill through the committee stage. There is other public business of an urgent nature which must be attended to. Certain money votes have been asked in order to pay the nation's bills. I therefore move that this committee rise and report progress." Mr. Laurier, who had heard, as had everybody withing the predicts of these buildings, that, the bill was to be withdrawn, could not let slip this opportunity of making, an attack on Sir Charles and on the Government. The bill had not been introduced until six weeks of the session had gon, he said, and the discussion on the second reading of the measure had not commenced until two months after the opening of mails.
