\$100,000 SAVED. Ontario Gains This Amount by the Present Method of Dealing Neglected Children.

Toronto, Ian. 18.—The report of the Department of Neglected and Dependent Children, which was presented to the Ontario House in manuscript, states that there are now 603 children in foster homes throughout the province and that the various Children's Aid Societies are doing a splendld work in the aggregate for neglected and homeless children. The principle of finding homes for children instead of keeping them in institutions for a number of years meets with continued favor from all classes; and is effective. ing a very substantial saving of public funds. It is estimated that if half of the children who are now in foster houses had been kept in institutions, the annual had been kept in institutions, the annual maintenance for them would be over \$30,000, and, taking the past four years, the cost would have been fully \$100,000. By finding homes for these children without unnecessary delay, the cost of large and expensive buildings and of many officials is avoided. The benefit to the children themselves, which, after all, is the chief consideration, is very pronounced.


