

The Phillipine Islands lie to the north of Borneo and Celebes. They are more than twelve hundred in num. ber, with an area of about 150,000 square miles. Population about 4,500. 000, three-fourths of whom are subject to Spain, the remainder governed acby independent native princes. The forests abound in abony, logwood, gum-trees and bamboos. The variety of fruit-trees is great, including the orange, citron, bread-fruit, mango, cocoanut. guava, tamarind, rose-apple


