Philippine Islands

The Philippine Islands lie to the north of Borneo and Celebes. They are more than twelve hundred in number, with an area of about 150,000 square miles. Population about 4,500,000, three-fourths of whom are subject to Spain, the remainder governed according to their own laws and customs, by independent native princes. The forests abound in ebony, logwood, gum-trees and bambos. The variety of fruit-trees is great, including the orange, citron, breadfruit, mango, cocconut, guava, tamarind, rose-apple, etc; other important productions of the vegetable kingdom being the banana, pineapple, sugar cane, cotton, tobacco, indigo, coffee, coca, cinnamon, vanilla, cassia, ginger, pepper, etc, with rice, wheat, maize and other cereals. Luzon has a population of 2,500,000. For some time the chief Spanish settlement was on Zebu; but in 1891 Manila was built and has since continued to be the seat of government.—Peoples Cyclopaedia.
