County Council

O.S. Advertising

Thursday afternoon
On Thursday afternoon all the mem-
bers were present, the warden in the
chair.

Report of the public school inspector
of East Grey was read.

Reports of finance and printing com-
mittees were presented and adopted
without discussion.

Mr McDonald presented report of a
special committee consisting of himself
and Messrs Gordon and Bishop, ap-
pointed to attend to the roof of the
court house, which had been in a leaky
condition for some time. They had
employed Mr. Fister to examine
the roof, and he reported that a new
roof was necessary. They advised
that the question of ventilation should
be given preference in constructing
the roof, and that the work should be
done at once, the architect to prepare
plans and the clerk to ask for tenders
forthwith. The proposed work was
estimated to cost about \$1,000. Mr. B.
McDonald said that everything might
have come to make a perfect job of it.
Warden Richardson drew attention to
the fact that there was an opportunity
for improving the appearance of the
building, which had been spoken of as
being very bad and entirely lacking
in architectural beauty. He suggested
that the court should hire and with
a view to improving the style of
the windows, the coloring of the shingles
could be able to hold greatly to
the appearance. The report was
adopted.

Mr. Binnie introduced a by-law for
the appointment of an enumerator to
take the census of the village of Han-
over, with a view to its incorporation
as petitioned for. George Packham
was appointed enumerator, and the by-
law was by all agreed.

Council adjourned until half past
two Friday afternoon.

Saturday Morning

Council met with the members all
present but McEachern, Bishop and
Gordon.

The warden read report of Sir G. H.
don Paul's school inspection for West
Grey, which was adopted. To the edification
committee.

The opinion of Mr. G. B. Smith on the
validity of Law 12, under which the
stipend of \$100 on county lines
has been left to municipalities was at-
tached to the report, with the recom-
mendation that it be printed in the
minutes as part of the report. The
solicitor's opinion was that the coun-
cil had acted illegally in passing the
by-law, and that it had set the power
to make grants to municipalities for road
and bridge purposes. The report was
considered in committee and finally
passed.
