

desessessesses The Late Dr Mahaffy

The early settlers in this part of the country will learn with regret of the leath of Dr Mahaffy an old, widely known and respected former resident of Artemesia which occurred at Lloydtown on the 5th of February 1899 at the rine age of 86 years. A brief resume of his life cannot fail to be interesting to

Dr Mahaffy came to Artentesia bout the year 1855 and settled at the load of Orango Valley where he . purhused 300 acres of land upon which he esided for some vears lie was an Irishman of an

linary genial and energetic temperanent and entered upon the arduous luties of his profession with the greatest enthusiasm. His nearest confreres at that time

ere situate in Owen Sound, Collingood and Durham and bis practise ached fully mid way from Drange Valley to those towns.

As a medical man and surgeon he was in the front rank, of his day and taken as cash.

was peculiarly successful in his treatnent of numbers of difficult cases with which he had to deal. In fact when he was in charge of a case it was populary supposed that a master hand was a he helm and that nothing further in an earthly sense could befdone.

He was a graduate in Medicine of Frinity College, Dublin and in Surgery of the Royal College of Surgeons in London, England and the experience gained by years spent in the large Hospitals in London was of inestimable benefit to the early settlers in this

Fond of travel and adventure after leaving college he went to sea as ship surgeon, in this capacity he visit ed the Vordo Islands, Cape Colony, Africa, and Melbourne Australia, stehm navigation for emigrant'vessels was not thought of then, and yoyage to those He plso made , several younger to America. The Dr first settled in Canada at Three Rivers, Quebec, coming west he and the late Dr Bull of Weston practiced in partnership at Bond Head, afterward removing to Klienburg purchased a farm where he lived a number

of years doing a lucrative practice.

The Dr was an ardent lover of horses und of horseback exercise and made his long visits almost always, in summer, on horseback; and was in the liabit o riding straight across country in the fall of the year when the crops were off if he could make a short-cut or save time by so doing; clearing the fences in his way in remembrance of old foxhunting days in Ireland. The Dr was an enthustatic Crangeman and turned out with his Lodgo regularly on the 19th, and was there from start to finish: yet for all this, there was nothing bigotted about his ideas and he had as warm friends among the Roman Catholics where he practiced, and held them in as warm esteam as those of other faiths.

Ho was a member of the Church of England, his father, the Rev Edward Mahaffy of Bexcourt; being the Rector of Bailieboro in the County of Cavan. The Dr's practice was very large, but the continual succession of frosty yet keeping his patients permanently poor he became discouraged with the country, and moved to Bond Head in Simeoco county, leaving Artemesia for good. During his residence here, the borest and most remote settler could always rely on the Dr's attendance and sympathy, no matter what sacrifice of time, cost or leabor was involved; and hundreds of cases of this nature he attended for which, no doubt, lie never received anything but thanks and good vishes.
