GENERAL NOTES
Temperature sentiment appears to be on the wane in Bruce County.

County Council
The County Council met at 7 p.m. on Monday in the Council Chambers, with the warden, Chas Gordon, in the chair and all the members present, viz. Division No 1, Chas Gordon, J.W. Frost; No 2, W.A. Totten, Joe Pringle; No 3, G. McKinnon, Henry Brigham; No 4, Matthew Richardson, Geo Watson; No 5, D.K. Preston, Neil McGowan; No 6, A.C. Peterson, Geo A. Willeson; No 7, John McDonald, Theo Willeson.
The warden addressed the members on matters that have occupied his attention since the Council last met.
Mr Peterson who takes his seat this session for the first time, was placed on the same committee as his predecessor Mr Chas Gordon, viz. Finance, County Property, Extension and Printing.
Quite a number of communications were read and referred to their respective committees and an invitation from the trustees of the G and M Hospital, asking the Council to inspect that institution, was discussed. It was decided to accept the invitation and the hour of the visit was set for 10 a.m. Tuesday.
TUESDAY EVENING SESSION
The Council resumed on Tuesday evening with the warden in the chair and all the members present.
A number of communications and accounts were read and referred to their respective committees.
The Rev. Mr. Leard addressed the Council on behalf of the work of the Children's Aid Society. He gave an account of the work done by the Society and asked that the Council give a grant of \$300 for the purpose of carrying on the work. This was referred to the Finance committee.
Mayor Middlebro addressed the Council on behalf of the hospital. He said that the town was giving \$500 towards the maintenance of the institution, while the County only gave \$200. He asked that the Council make up the difference which would be \$300.
