Artemesia Council

The Council of the township of Artemesia met in the town hall, Flesherton, on Saturday, February 3, 1900.

The members were all present, the reeve in the chair. The minutes of the last regular meeting were read and confirmed. The following communications were presented and read: W. J. Love, certificate as to digging ditch by S. Sheardson on the 2nd concession, N. E. Report of committee appointed to look into the matter of road at lot 24, con. 14, that they had ordered some repairs, and arranged with Mr. Webster for land for a further deviation of road. County Treasurer, list of lands liable to be sold for arrears of taxes in 1900. The Reeve's report as to Treasurer's surreties, Alex. McLeod, and others asking change in boundaries of S. S. Nos. 6, 7, and 12; by taking lots 6, 7, 8 and 9, con. 2, N. D. R., from U. S. No. 12, and place the same in S. S. No. 6; and lots 11, 12, 13, 14, con. 2, N. D. R., from S. S. No. 7, and place the same in S. S. No. 6. Thos. McArthur, letter asking to have his lot (11) con. 4, taken from S. S. No. 6, and place the same in S. S. No. 10. Donald McLeod, Arch'd McMullen and R. McGill, petition asking changes in the boundaries of S. S. Nos. 6, 7, and 10, by removing lots 142 and 143, con. 2 S. W., and lots 142, 143 and 144 from S. S. No. 6, and place the same in S. S. No. 10; and take lot 26, con. 2, N. D. R., from S. S. No. 9; and place the same in S. S. No. 10. The report of the auditors on the accounts of 1899, was presented.

Thompson—Muir—That the auditors report be referred to committee of the whole council for final audit.—carried.

Thompson—Muir—That the clerk give the proper notices of the suggested change to the boundaries of S. S. Nos. 6, 7, and 10, in accordance with applications presented to the council.—carried.

Boyd—Muir—That the report of the committee appointed to arrange with Mr. Weber as to location of road at lot 24, con. 14, be accepted and the matter carried out as suggested by said committee.—carried.

Kells—Muir—That the Reeve's report of treasurer's surreties be accepted and filed.—carried.

Muir—Boyd—That the mover provide material for railing on embankment on gravel road at lot 8, con. 1, N. D. R.—carried.

Boyd—Muir—That the clerk write Thos. Talbot, pathmaster, with reference to a pile of lumber in his road division, authorizing him to have the same removed and allow the party doing the work the cost thereof on next season's road work.—carried.

Kells—Thompson—That the auditors' report on the accounts of 1899, as presented and finally passed by this council be received and 200 copies be printed for distribution.—carried.

Thompson—Muir—That John Webster be paid \$10 for work and part pay for land for roadway at lot 24, con. 14, as per report of committee.—carried.

Boyd—Thompson—That the auditors be paid their salary, \$10, as per bill.—carried.

Kells—Thompson—That \$130 be ex-
tended on Valley Road, near Hoggs
mill, north to the 10th concession, with
a view of making said road reasonably
fit for travel.—carried.

Kells—Muir—That the reeve and Mr.
Thompson be paid \$4 each for 2 days'
service on committee to road on Davis
concession.—carried.

Thompson—Boyd—That the reeve and
Mr. Kells be paid \$4 each; their ex-
penses in attending convention at Owen
Sound on invitation of county council.—carried.

Kells—Thompson—That R. Loug-
head be paid \$18.00 for road work on
Valley Road at lot 25, con. 14, and
John Weber be paid \$4 for putting in
culvert on said road.—carried.

Thompson—Kells—That S. Shear-
son be paid \$1.50 for digging on 2nd
con. E., as certified by W. J. Love.—carried.

Kells—Thompson—That the mem-
bers of this council make enquiries re-
garding the circumstances of persons
receiving aid from this council as in-
dicated and report at next meeting.—
carried.
