IN THE ORCHARD.

There is a general concensus of opinion among good fruit growers that there is profit in the business if conducted properly; but not more than other men follows the business with a just conception of its needs, while local differences may make rules and advice concerning crops and methods of culture inapplicable for all sections, there is, nevertheless, certain advice that will be of service all over the country. To go into these points of success in detail it is necessary in the first place to give not only the fruit trees and shrubs during the growing season, but intelligent and methodical cultivation. Let the experience of one year teach something that will make the work of the next more satisfactory, good cultivation, which can best be done by planting forage crops in the late summer and covering them under in the spring. Such green crops help to keep the land warm in winter, and improve the mechanical conditions of the soil.
