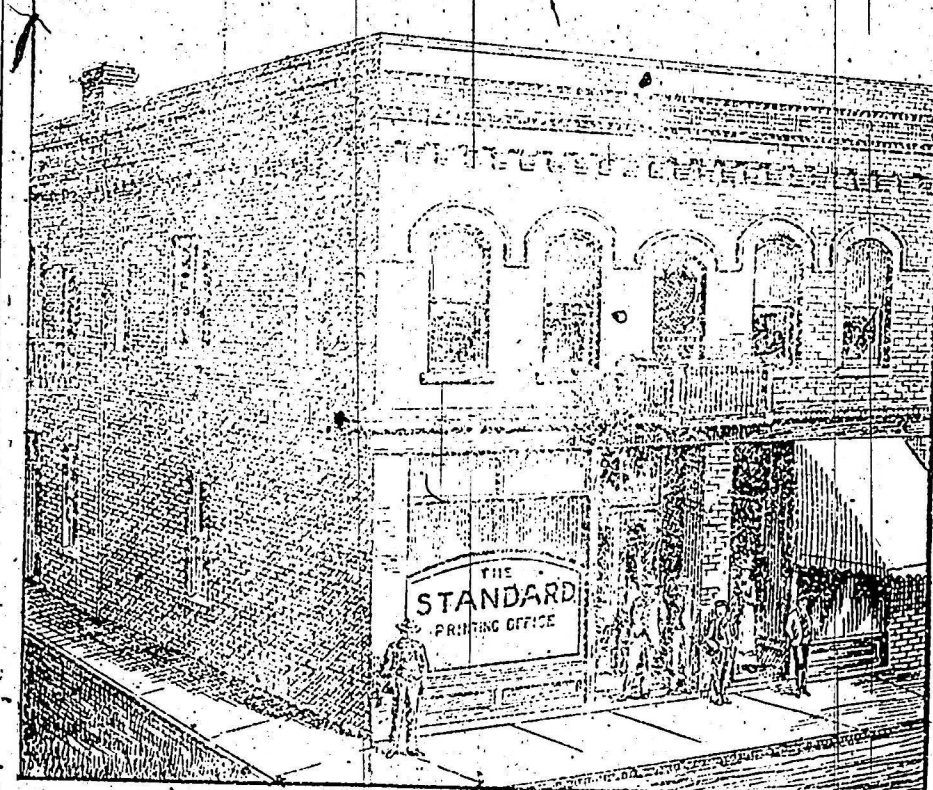

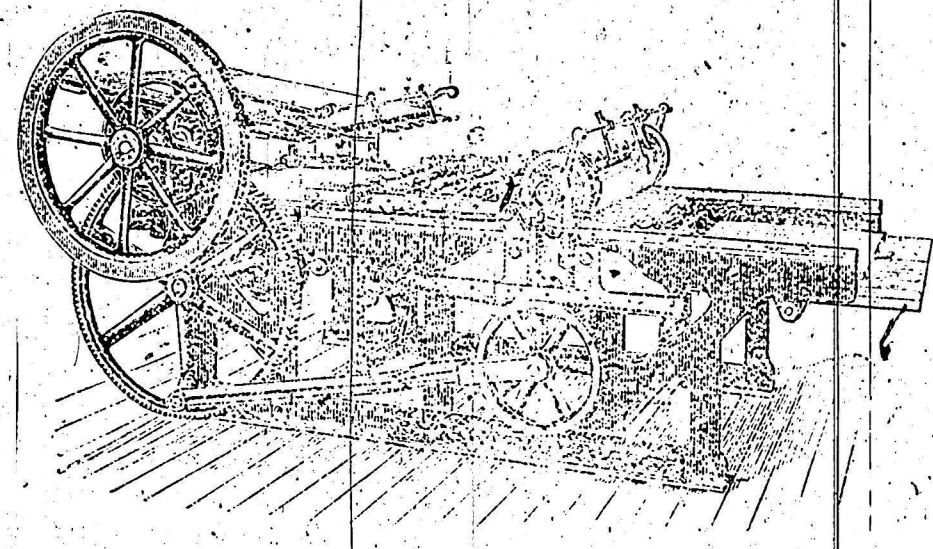

TWENTY YEARS OLD.

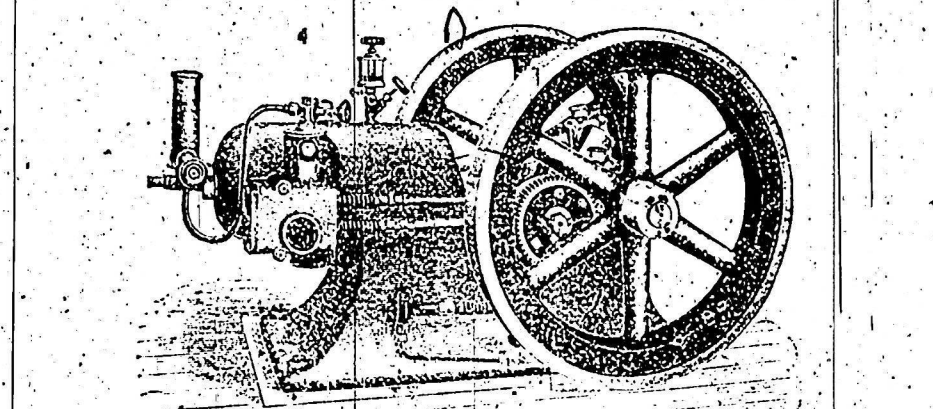

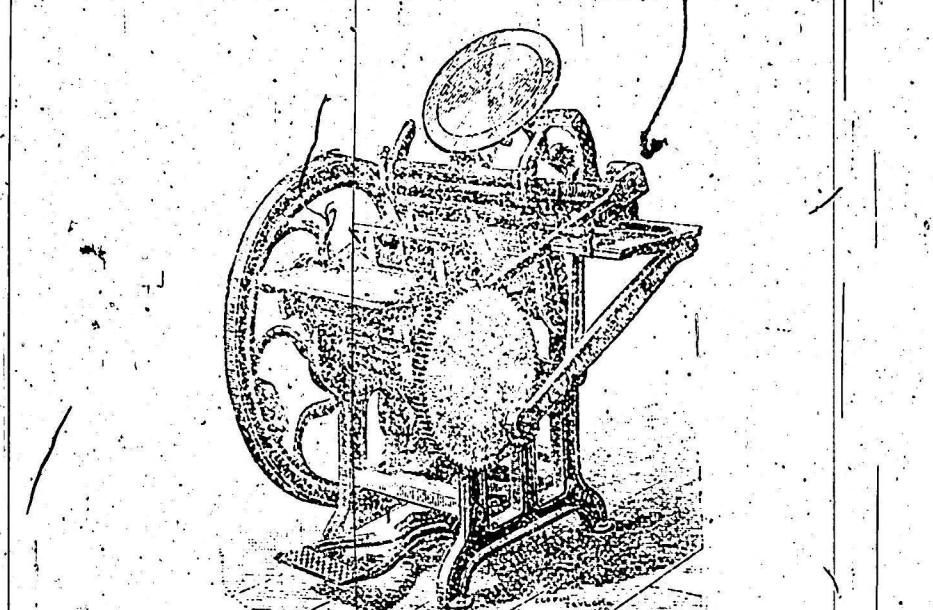

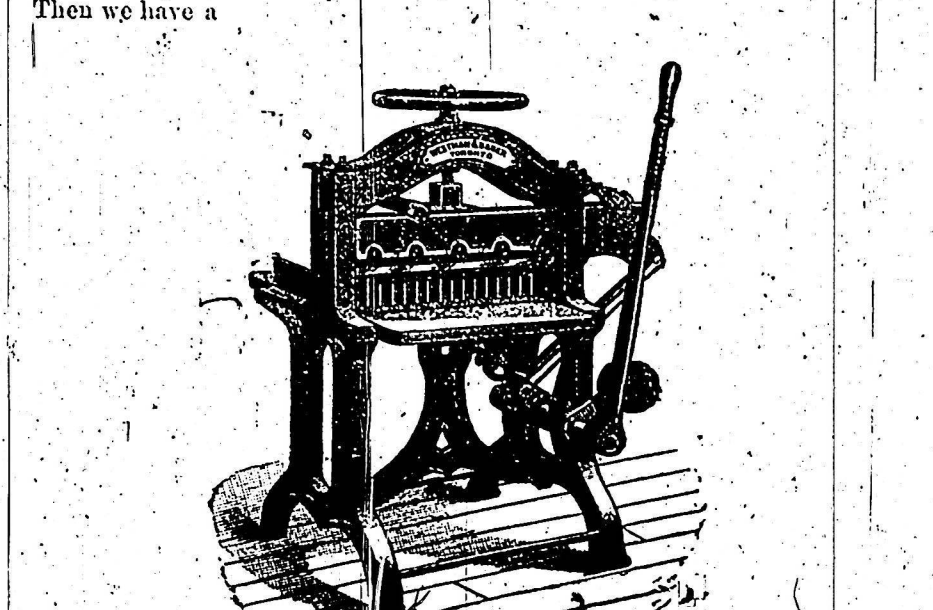
A new power press was put in last December on moving into this new building, and a few weeks later a gasoline engine was added which now drives both newspaper and job presses.

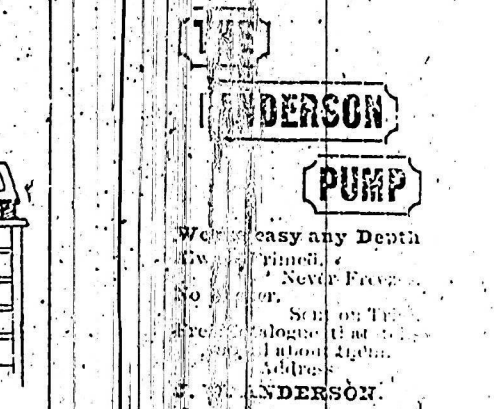

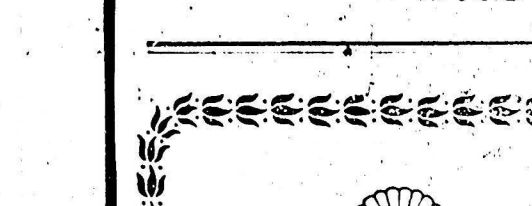
