#### Good citizenship and Scientific Temperance.

One of the most interesting series of ectures that have been given in Markdate for some time were those delivered by Hey. E. O. Taylor, A.M., D.D., of Bostom on the subject of temperance, under the auspices of the Markdale branch of the W.C.T.U. Mr. Taylor has a splendid delivery and takes a different line of thought from the average temperance lecture, a broader view of existing circumstances and although he states that prohibition is the best cure for intemperance prescribes a great many other remedies for the righting of the evils pertaining to

the liquor traffic, There was not a large attendance on Saturday evening in the Presbyterian church when Mr. Taylor delivered his first lecture on "Microbes and Men." The average person would have wondered how the two could possibly be connected in a temperance lecture but the title was appropriate as those who heard it know. The speaker detailed the origin of several kinds of alcohol, and said that temperance workers when speaking of alcohol generally concluded there was just one kind when there were a great many. He exploded the old theory that there was a certain percentage of alcohol in almost every article of food. It was believed by many twenty-five years ago that even bread contained a small percentage of alcohol but it was not the case when bread was properly cooked, as in the process of cooking the alcohol which was in the dough escaped. There was no alcohol in a sound apple but in the preparation of apple juice for cider alcohol was developed. Alchohol was found to more or less extent in canned and preserved fruit and in homemade wine from the fact that those who made it ignorantly exposed it to the conditions required for the developing of alcohol. 


