Thousands of tons of poison are now used in the manufacturing arts, including a quantity of arsenic. According to the British Registrartieneral, only twelve or fourteen deaths occur annually from arsenic in

England, host of them being acci-dental. But medical men, who have enquired into the matter, assert that an immense amount of ill-health arises. from the use of this drug, which nery be innocently taken at lunch time or absorbed in the bed-

Now, shot is extensively used in washing bottles, and in this process a good deal of the arsenio gets detached and adheres to the bottles.
