We should be very grateful to have two lessons from the book of Revelation; more would have been better, for it is the only book of all the 66 that has a special blessing pronounced upon those who read and keep it (i, 3; xxii, 7). It is a revelation, not a mystery: a revelation is the unfolding of a mystery. It is the revelation of Jesus Christ So if we love Him we shall be desperately in love with this book, even though we be in some sense sent to some Patinos for it, and we shall be very apt to if we make much of the great topic of the book as stated in i; 7; xxii, 7, 12, 20.
