

WENT-SIX MEN KILLED

shocking Catastrophe in the Detroit factory. Twenty-six men are dead, five unidentified, and so terribly blackened that identification is almost impossible and the men are lying in the various parts of the city suffering from cuts and burns and other injuries, all results of the explosion of the boilers of the Penberthy Injector Company's large plant at the corner of Abbott Street and Brooklyn Avenue at 9:30 o'clock yesterday.

Following is a list of the dead—E. Holloman, Louis Henning, Frank Malloy, A. C. Miller, Eugene Stratman, R. Mullock, Joseph Conley, Charles Marvin, Joseph Koseck, Christopher George Schonher, Charles Jacob Koobets, William Mann, Ward Burch, John Schwalbe, Richard Ryan, Douglass Dickinson (boy), Richel, five unidentified bodies, in addition to those more seriously injured a dozen or more of employees suffered comparatively slight injuries. Eighteen men and boys have as yet been located, either at their homes or at the hospitals. The dead bodies account for five of the officers of the company, they feel positive that the portion of the remaining 15 at the Penberthy Injector Company's occupied half a square at the corner of Abbott Street and Brooklyn Avenue.

CAMP WITHOUT WARNING. The awful crash came without the slightest warning. The floors and the rear building bulged upwards and then crashed down a mass of debris. Windows in houses block around were broken by concussion and flying bricks flew out from the neighboring yards. Flames leapt out from the ruins almost immediately, and the horror of fire was added to the suffering ones imprisoned in the city. Pending their arrival temporary hospitals, the floors and roof had fallen at angles and formed a sort of huge under which the fire burned.
