Some Big Figures.

The Independent Order of Foresters is so well known in Canada that probably those who are not specially interested in its work do not pay particular attention to the magnitude of that work. Those who do not will be somewhat surprised to know that during the past year 28,824 applied for membership. As an evidence of the value of this institution to the homes of the countries where it is operating it may be said that last year it sent cheques for insurance to 1,455 presidencies, totalling altogether in payment to widows and orphans and permanently disabled brethren \$1,738,920. This in other words means that during every hour of the year 1901 the I. O. F. paid to beneficiaries \$200, as nearly as may be. It is still more surprising to know that it increased its accumulated funds during the same time by \$800,000, or an average of about \$300 per hour. The I. O. F. and Dr. Oronhyatekwa, its supreme chief ranger, are to be congratulated upon these splendid results. The doctor took hold of this institution when it was a struggling, and, most people thought, a failing one. It has been largely by his energy and genius that the marvellous results which have been mentioned above have been achieved. Canada owes him a debt of gratitude for bringing such a measure of success to an institution which has done so much to make Canada favorably known abroad. The Supreme Court of the Order will shortly meet in Los Angeles, Cal., and it is safe to say no governing body of an institution ever met under more favorable circumstances or with a better report of work and progress before it.—Toronto Daily Globe, March 14th.
