# SUPPLEMENT TO THE STANDARD, APRIL 17

## Glencol Council.

Summary of proceedings of Glencol council meeting held Feb. 8th, 1902. Members all present. The reeve in the chair. Minutes of former meeting read and confirmed. Report of committee on treasurer's surties read and accepted. The Chronicle office was given the township printing; by-law 416, appointing township officers was passed; D. J. McNabb was granted \$8.00 for the benefit of Moses Mallion, an indigent; Thos. Morrow was paid \$1.00 for repair of bridge at lot 101, con. 8, W.T.R., in 1901; O. Ramage was paid \$28.86 for printing; the Municipal World was paid \$16.58 for assessment and other stationary and copies of the Municipal World; Thos. Lawder was paid \$1.50 for two searches re treasurer's surties. The Council adjourned to Feb. 16th at 10 a. m.

The council met pursuant to adjournment, all the members present, the reeve in the chair. Minutes of last meeting, February 8th, read and confirmed.

McMillan-McInnis—That the auditor's report as re-audited by this council be accepted, and that they be paid \$8 each, also \$3 each for special audit for 1902.—Carried.

McInnis-Arrowsmith—That the petition of Jno. Falgout and '41' others asking for tax on dogs, be not entertained, there being a petition against it.—Carried.

Davis-McInnis—That the reeve issue his cheque in favor of Archy McKechnie for the sum of \$4.00 to buy food for Geo. Roy, an indigent.—Carried.

Arrowsmith-McInnis—That Mr. Black be paid the sum of \$14.60 for attendance and supplies for Alice Flynn and that he also take 300 lbs. of hay that is on her place.—Carried.

Davis-Arrowsmith—That R. Martin be paid the sum of \$2.70 for hay and oats re Alice Flynn.—Carried.

Davis-McMillan—That this council memorialize the Government to amend the Municipal Act so that the Reeves of the municipalities will constitute the County Council.—Carried.

Arrowsmith-McMillan—That the reeve and Mr. Davis be paid \$1.00 each for search in Registry Office re treasurer's surties.—Carried.

Davis-McMillan—That the clerk notify Mr. Jas. Edge, ex-treasurer, to hand over to Mr. Daniel Edge the sum of \$1740.63, as shown by auditor's report. Also all property belonging to the township of Glencol now in his possession.—Carried.

Davis-McMillan—That the reeve and clerk be paid \$2.00 each, and councillor Geo. E. Arrowsmith \$3.00 for committee work re Alice Flynn.—Carried.

Davis-McMillan—That the clerk be

paid \$1.24 for postage and \$1.00 for express charges.—Carried.

Davis-Arrowsmith—That cheque issue in favor of the clerk for \$30.00 on account of salary.—Carried.

Note.—The members of council had such a struggle pulling each other out of snowbanks on the 8th of February that very little municipal business was done, and the Provincial auditor claimed minute books and others papers immediately after the meeting of the 16th.
