## The Meat Quotidien.

The Toronto World enquired from several physicians what they would advise in view of the present condition of the meat market, and the almost prohibitive prices at which the choicest cuts are held. There seems to be but one opinion among medical men: they advocate a vegetarian diet as being the most healthful. One physician said that the consumption of meat could be reduced one-half; another that the article could be expunged from the bills-of-fare of most households without any loss of stamina or flesh on the part of those who have been accustomed to meats one, two or three times a day. Dr. Dorman Allen says: "If increased rates in the price of meat would effect an abstinence from meat by the public, it would be a grand blessing in disguise. Medical science has proved beyond a doubt that much of the sickness among the people is due to excessive dieting on meat. Gentlemen.—The time has already been fixed when you will be called on to select a representative to the tenth Ontario parliament. I have given this question considerable thought and have more fully than ever decided that party politics, at any rate in the provincial, is neither desirable nor wise, but on the contrary, often positively foolish and injurious. Among the important questions with which our legislature has to deal are the following: Education, Agriculture, Municipal Affairs, the establishment and maintenance of our public institutions, such as prisons, reformatories, asylums, and their should be a good deal of attention to the question of law reform, that is, to extend the jurisdiction of the division courts, and so forth. The centre riding of Grey is one of the most important in the province, and is, therefore, entitled to more consideration than it receives. Are you satisfied with what has been done for you by the legislature? Persistent and factious opposition to the government has in a great measure brought about, if not a spirit of retaliation on the part of the government and their supporters, at least a feeling of indifference that has been very prejudicial. Would not your interests be better served by non-partisan consideration of every proposal according to its merits. The bill passed by legislature in 1900 which provided aid for outlets in large drainage work has had far-reaching effect. The statement of the department of works shows that thirty-five thousand has been voted during the last two seasons for that purpose, which represents a total expenditure of nearly three hundred thousand by the farmers themselves. This year the government contributed twenty-five thousand five hundred and ninety or a total expenditure of two hundred and eleven thousand three hundred by which two hundred and eleven thousand seven hundred and fifty two acres of land were benefitted.
