Instruction in Drill, Athletics, Revolver Practice and Civil Law.

The life of a Toronto policeman, especially during the period of probation, is not a pleasant one, as the twenty dodd men who are now undergoing instruction have discovered. From 9 o'clock in the morning till midnight these young men are engaged in the various duties required of them before they are allowed to wear a uniform and a 'beat" assigned them to cover alone. The probationary period generally is from three to four months, and at the end of that time the recruit is supposed to have quired sufficient knowledge of the duties of a policeman to be placed in the lowest class.

The majority of applications for positions on the force come from the country, and the applicants generally are strong, healthy, and welldeveloped young men. When the force is to be strengthened, the chief police notifies the applicants that they shall attend his office on a certain date. If 20 men are required, probably 45 are called up for preliminary examination. The applicant must be 21 years of applicant must be 21 years of age, weigh 160 pounds, and stand 5 feet tion.
