See the record of a previous weeping in Num. xi. 4, 10, 18, 18, 20, and a later one in Num. xxy, 6, and note that it was all because of unbelief, as was, the weeping of Mary Magdalene at the tomb on the resurrection morning. Joy and peace come by believing, but in so other way (Rom. xv, 13; John xiv, 1, 27; xx, 27-29).
