EDITOR STANDARD.

Dear Mr. Rutledge, -A few days ago was in Banff and when in a hotel there I saw in the reading room, a late copy of the Markdale STANDARD. It was like meeting an old friend a long way from home, and I felt proud of the STANDARD in comparing it with other papers there. Apart from its local interest to me it seemed a very respectable newspaper 2500 miles from home. Banff is situated in the midst of scenery wild, yet sublime and beautiful, surrounded by snow-capped mountains. The little town itself is 4,500 feet from sea-level, and the peaks around arise to 8,000, 9.000 and as high as 10,000 feet. In crossing the Prairie Province I had met with a number of Artemesia people and here I found Frank Beattie whom I knew when he was a boy. Mountain air seems to agree with him for he is a fire type of physical mauhood, and it has not spoiled him in other respects for he is the same kind genial good fellow we knew him in carly days. I had a drive with him to points of interest and had the pleasure of introduction to his wife and family. I met also Philip Hurlburt here who will be remembered by Kimberley and Euphrasia readers of your paper. He also vied with Mr. Beattie in making

my short visit there pleasant. At Banff I bathed in the crater of a volcano geyser in water at a temperature of 90 degrees, while a snow storm was falling on my head. At another point a short distance off it boils up out of the rock at 120 degrees heat. I wish I could describe a two days' ride through the Rocky Mountains but I will not attempt it; beautiful, grand, sublime beyond my poor efforts to portray. In British Columbia I have been surprised and pleased with the magnitude of the trees. I spent half a day in the Forest Park at Vancouver. I stepped the trunk of a fallen nine, the average diameter of which was 5 feet, and it measured from root to where the first branches sprang over 200 feet: when standing it would reach up 400 feet. I measured round several cedars between 60 and 70 feet in circumference.
