An apple tree must be fed if it is to produce fruit, and no diet is more suitable or inexpensive than a leguminous cover crop. Trees require moisture and food; therefore grass and weeds must be removed. To succeed the farmer must plow his orchard and till the ground, tillage being continued frequently during carly summer. By midsummer wood growth generally ceases and then tillage should stop. A cover crop sown then will not only protect the soil from washing but will add humus to it, while a clover crop will gather all the nitrogen necessary for the

next year's growth. 
