CONCRETE ON THE FARM.

FOR WALLS AND FLOORING OF BARN IT IS INVARIABLE.

Synopsis of Address by T. C. Raynor, Before St. John, N.B., Farmers' Institute.

Wherever a farmer is building new barns, or changing his stables, the question of the use of concrete for floors and walls is a live one.

In a country where lumber is comparatively cheap, concrete is not likely to come into general use for making walls of barns, but for flooring it is without question the best and cheapest substance that can be employed.

Concrete is a mixture of clean gravel or pure sand and cement. There are several kinds of cement.

Before laying the stable floor a good foundation should be prepared. It should be made firm and solid by the addition of gravel or small stones thoroughly pounded down.

IN LAYING CONCRETE only as much as can be conveniently reached, say a piece four feet square should be laid at one time.

By the use of corrugated sleepers made like railway rails it is quite practicable to make a good floor which would form the ceiling of the story below.

VICTIMS OF HOTEL. Twenty-three lives, Lord's Hotel, Chicago.

A Chicago despatch says three persons met death in the Lincoln Hotel, 175 Street, at six o'clock on morning. Little damage to the hotel, but the densest that the persons who death were overcome, and few assistance could be given.
