having unburdened his mind. The body was sent to the hospital morgue, and the ward tenders prepared to burn the ragged clothes in which the old Jew had come to the hospital. The old man had given no instructions as to what was to be done. with his things, and this seemed patural, as he appeared to have nothing of value. He had given an old red handkerchief, tied up at the corners, to anuse to keep for him, and she had put it in a drawer. He had incidentally sked that care be taken of his vest, but he did not seem over-anxious about

When the ward tenders had piled the clothes on the floor the nurse appeared with the handkerchief. Before proceeding to put it on top of the pile she untied it and found scrip valued at \$17,000. She showed it to some of the doctors, who promptly went through the old clothes. In the lining of the vest they found a piece of oilcloth containing securities for \$14,000. In another part of the clothes they found astatement showing that the old man's income in the last year was \$3,000.

The value of Hyman's estate is estimated at \$100,000, the old man having held stock in the Canada Permanent and Western Canada Mortgage Company, British-Canadian Loan Company, Canada Landed and National Invest ment Company, British America Assurance Company, Toronto Electric Light Company, Western Assurance Company, Dominion Savings and Loan Company, Toronto Mortgage Company, The Building and Loan Association, London and Canadian Loan Company. Other papers show receipts for money deposited. Most of the scrip when found was in ouvelopes, all addressed to Mrs. Sophia Hyman, Churchville,

Eli Hyman was 70 years old, and went to Torouto 33 years ago. He was sometimes selling papers. He was well known as a beggar in the east end. He sold papers on Saturday night and slept in a stable on York street. He was so eager a collector of cash that when his dividends were due he would go to the brokers and get the cheques, asking also for the stamps which would have been used if the cheques had of been mailed. For a time he was a pensioner of the Holy Blossom synagogue."

Coroner J. J. Johnson issued warrant for an inquest on Hyman's body, and a post-mortem was made.
