To the friends of Neglected Children throughout the County: We desire to bring before you the chins of a society that has, during the gren years of its operations, secured be loval support of many of the the milanthrophic people of the county in philament for the better protection of registed, dependent or ill-treated

CHARACTER OF THE SOCIETY. The Society operates under the prorisions of the "Children's Protection Act of Ontario," passed in 1893, and he the consent and approval of the Lieutenant Governor of the Province. Inder this authority about thirty imilar societies have come into existence and as a result nearly 2,000 Canadian children have been committed to their guardianship and have been placed in foster homes. Mr. J. J. Kelso, whose office is in the Parliament buildings, Toronto, is the Provincial Superintendent of this Department.

THE AIM OF THE SOCIETY. The aim of the Society is to care for my boy under the age of 14 and any girl auder the ago of 16 years, who, by reason of the neglect or drunkeness or other vices of its parents or guardians. is suffered to be growing up without selutary parental control and education, or in circumstances exposing such child to an idle and dissolute life.

METHOD OF PROCEDURE. The mode of procedure under this Act is of the most simple kind,

First. If you know of any child who is neglected or ill-treated sond word to our agent, Rev. Jas. Lediard, Owen Sound, and he will at once investigate the case and if the condition of the child is such as to need interference, he will counsel or warn or prosecute as the case may seem to demand, and bear in mind that the information you give him, will be treated as strictly private and confidential

In the second place. Any person knowing of any such neglected or illtreated child may themselves lay an information before any magistrate or justice of the pence, and that it is not only their right to do so but it is also their duty.

THE CHILDREN'S SHELTER. The Society has also, in accordance with the requirements of the "Act," to provide a home or shelter, to which all such children are taken when committed by the court and where they remain until a suitable Foster home is found for them. The Society's shelter is situated on the corner of Bay and Russel streets, Owen Sound; and is in charge of Mrs. D. Campbell. Nearly 40 children have found a home there for longer or shorter periods during

the past year. SUPERVISION. The Society is responsible for the care and oversight of these children until they reach the age of 18 years and during this time they are visited regalarly by the agent, the Society thus assuring themselves that they are recieving proper treatment, sufficient clothing, schooling; and other priv-

eleges and advantages properly belonging to a child. GENERAL REMARKS. The County of Grey Society has about 70 such wards at present for whom it is responsible and the work of caring for them is necessarily on the increase and o cupies nearly the whole time of the agent, Rev. Jas. Lediard. During the past year no less than 10 additional children were committed to

the Society by the order of the Courts and in the same period the Society through its agent interfered in behalf of over 50 neglected children, securing better treatment for them. CHILDREN IN RURAL DISTRICTS.

The condition of children in the rural districts of the county is at present attracting the attention of the Society and during the year the agent will endeavor to reach some parts of the county not yet visited and by public addresses and otherwise will call attention to the aims and needs of
