"It is at once the Hightest and most prestale method of cooking meat. Charoal or cindma make the best fire. Prepare the fire about 20 minutes before it is required for the actual cooking. Place a thick layer of finders over a good fire and allow them to burn clear and bright If there is may doubt, sprinkle a lite tle salt over the coals ; this will allay all smoke and make the fire burn satisfactorily Turn a chop

every half minute. When cooked—a chop of about five or six ounces will take six minutes—sprinkle very lightly with salt and serve on a hot plate. 'All that glitters is not gold.' and, on the other hand, not all that finds its way to the dust-bin is worthless. For instance, in Salford, England, in one year 208,620 mineral water bottles, 15,700 other bottles, and ninety-seven tons of to broken glass, estimated to represent 650,000 broken bottles, worth \$15. 000 at retail rates, were picked out of the refuse at theirdestructors. The marked bottles were returned to the makers at 1d. per dozen, while the other glass was sold fog £150 to be used in making mortar. In Glasgow the corporation issue bags to business houses , for the collection of waste paper, the contents being gathered periodically. In this way eighteen tons of paper are collected weekly, and a profit of \$1,000 per year is realized. Solder is extracted from old tin cans found among the refuse and is sold-for a fair price.
