PULPWOOD DUTIES.

The Ontario Government was no tified that the United States courts, before which the question of increased duties on pulpwood going into that country had been tried, had decided that prohibition of export in Ontario is not an export duty : therefore Canadian exporter had not to pay an additional duty rato the United States on pulp. It was decided by the same court, however, that the Quebec regulations do not constitute an export duty, and Quebec is accordingly not relieved of the penalty provided by the United States tariff.

Capt. Scott, R. N. the commander of the Discovery, enetrated one hundred miles further, outh than any previous explorer, and discovered an extensive mounainous region, hitherto absolutely inknown, extending to 83 degrees, 20 minutes south. He thinks this adicates that the land stretches to he Pole in a series of very lofty nountains, which is considered to be ar the most important geographical esult ever achieved in Antarctic exloration The Discovery wintered our hundred miles further south han any, other vessel.


