EMIGRATION SWINDLES.

Serious Charges Against Agents in England.

There is something like a "boom" in Canada at present, and a number of more or less unscrupulous emigration agents in different parts of England are reaping a harvest therefrom, says the London Mail.

The methods adopted by these gentry were revealed the other day by the Commissioner of Emigration for Canada. The agents advertise their willingness to secure positions for intending emigrants on farms.
When an applicant for information appears at an agent's office he interrogated as to his means, and the agent privately regulates his fee accordingly. The emigrant is promised a situation for sums varying from £2 10s to £5, or "a specially good berth" on a bonus arrangement, which may mean the payment by the emigrant to the agent of from £25 to £45 annually. extended over several years.

Another dodge is for the agent to promise the emigrant instruction in agriculture on his arrival in Canada for a remuneration frequently. amounting to £50.


