Origin of Custom of Wearing Rings Lost in Antiquity.

The custom of wearing rings to adorn the hand is of such remote date that all attempts to trace its origin are lost in the obscurity of antiquity; but the primary intention of this practice, in early ages ernment; and this was symbolically communicated by delivering a ring to the person on whom they were

intended to be conferred. In conformity to this ancient usage the Christian church employed, the ring in the ceremony of marriage (which was first adopted by the Greek church) as a symbol of the of the earthly goods with which he thus endowed her.

Under the Roman Consuls, rings were at first manufactured of iron, hand, hence denominated the ring finger. Increasing wealth soon superseded an ornament of this inferior metal by introducing rings of more costly materials, and these made of gold were afterward so very general that it is related after the celebrated battle of Cannae Hannibal sent a bushel of thom to the Senators at Carthage, of which he had despoiled the slain and prison-

Under the Emperors, the common gold rings, although they were originally prohibited unless personally given by the Emperor.
