FELICITATIONS.

In the House on Thursday, Sept. 17, before the House adjourned, Dr. Sproule reminded the House that this was the 25th anniversary of the great National Policy victory. He congratulated Sir Wilfrid Laurier upon the fact that after these 25 years he still possessed his health and strength, and evinced a desire to work for the best for his country. Besides himself and Sir Wilfrid, there were only two members, Messrs. Costigan and Haggart, who had served the country continuously since 1878. He wished to congratulate the country and the House that during this time the National Policy, which had during that period worked such good for the country, had been adopted by the Liberals after so much early opposition. (Hear, hear.) He wished to congratulate the country that those who had so long opposed Sir John McDonald had become converts to his views for the benefit of Canada.

Mr. Fielding, in reply, regretted that Sir Wilfrid Laurier was not present to return thanks to Dr. Sproule's complimentary remarks. If this was the National Policy, however, he could not understand why the Conservatives could want to oppose the Government. (Laughter.) It should rather be matter of gratitude that it had passed into the hands of the Liberals. He joined the other Liberals in congratulating Dr. Sproule that he had so long represented the people of Canada in Parliament. He was gratified that there was always a recognition on both sides of the House of long and faithful services, as all members alike recognized that they were working for the common good of their country. (Applause.)
