ANTS IN SURGERY.

Ants with long and powerful mar dibles have been successfully used for making surgical stitches. The mamaking surgical stitches. The ma-lority of Greek surgeons keep stocks of them, and upon the arrival of a person suffering from a clean cut the ants are brought into use. The edges of the cut are brought together with the fingers of one hand, while the ant, held with a pair of forceps, is the other, its mandibles biting through the flesh on both sides and holding, the edges together. 
