#### Notes and Comments.

The Rev Dr. Hillis predicts that golden age of religious enthusiasn and activity is about to sweep over the United States. Such a tide is now sweeping over Wales and is about to spread to England. Are we to have a new "Age of Faith?"

Out of 30,000 applications for veteran's land grants only 4,000 have received land. As, under the regulations, there can be only one military land grant per square mile it would require 80,000 square miles to be surveyed in order to provide for these grants, even presuming that the whole area was eligible for settlement. There are about 100 lots to a township so that it would require about 1,200 townships to provide the necessary land, ther being four lots per square mile.

In the new Parliament of Ontari the farming community has the largest number of representatives, there being 21 tillers of the soil in the new House The lawyers come next with 18; 14 ar merchants, 13 practicing physicians and the next largest class is that of the journalists, of whom there are eigh elected; six manufacturers, five con tractors, four agents, two undertakers two school inspectors, two cattle dealers, one auctioneer and one principal of a correspondence school make up the balance of the House.

Paris, "the mother of expositions, never makes the mistake of not allow ing herself ample time when she deter mines upon a great enterprise. The Commerce Committee of the French Chambers has, accordingly, already reported the Government proposition to create a universal exposition in Paris in 1920 to commemorate the founding of the French Republic. A great many things may happen before 1920, but the promoters of the exposition evidently have confidence that the Third Republic will live to commemor ate the semi-centennial of its founding.

The Czar of Russia and the Empero of Germany might, if they please dispute with each other as to which of the two owns the greater number of palaces. Each might sleep in a different house every night for a month and ot exhaust the number of his various dwelling places, according to "The Indianapolis News." The Czar is said to own many country seats -which are kept up in every detail, furnished and furbished and crowded with servantsinto which he has never set foot. King Edward of England, while regularly occupying only four, has a dozen or more homes, which are ready for him at all times

Prof. Coleman, in a lecture delivered Monday evening, said millions of years ago the site of what is now Toronto was washed by a great sea, which stretched down to Brazil, and that there was then a continent where Hudson Bay now is. At a more recent period, but still thousands of years ago there had been a river from Georgian Bay to some point near Scarboro Heights, and it was only after some upheaval that the water had been forced around by the St. Clair River and Lake Erie. During the first glacial period the site of the city of Toronto was covered with ice to thickness of probably several thousand feet. After this there was a period of vegetation, succeeded again by another ice age. The question as to whether Toronto will again be covered with ice was left unanswered.

#### A Revival of Revivals.

One of the striking manifestations of the times, is the revival, in different places and under different auspices, of religious feeling and enthusiasm. Most remarkable of these religious awakenings is the great revival in Wales, which began some time ago in Wales and is still in full progress. The leadership of the movement is held by Mr. Evan Roberts, and it differs in many respects from all previous revivals in Wales, but chiefly in the fact that it does not seem to be confined to any particular church. It differs, also, from preceeding seasons of spiritual quickening in the fact that there is no fearful looking forward to judgment and punishment to come. It is a religion of gladness, joy and peace which has spread over South Wales in a tide of fervor and enthusiasm. It seems to have brought happiness to whole villages and communities and to have absorbed the interest and attention of the people almost to the exclusion of everything else, and the ordinary vocations of life are practically suspended. The fact that there is no sectarianism in it is much more significant in Wales than it would be in America, for, owing to recent and perhaps continued Nonconformist bitterness over the new Education act, it might be supposed that the present revival would, as one of its effects, turn the people away from the Established Church, as was usually the case in preceeding revivals. In Wales, however, this quickening religious enthusiasm seems to know no church lines, but to pervade whole communities and make them act as one in spiritual fellowship. This is the best evidence of its convine character and gives to it more than usual significance.

No one seems to be able to tell why or wherefore this awakening, has come about, The student of history may refer to his Hallam and assert that such awakenings in the past have usually followed periods of skepticism and unbelief. This makes it seem not improbable that the time is ripe for another such season of religious uprising, as opposed to the materialistic. and scientific teachings of the last half century. The time may be due for the return of the high tides of fuith, as opposed to the age of reason. The "Saturday Review" suggests that "possibly the country folks have wearied of the litter feuds of rival denominations and of the vaporings of the young preacher from the university college who has been striving to Hegelianize Calvinistic Methodism." The supposition may be true, but, if so, this weariness, apparently, is shared by city folks as well, and not

only in Wales, but in London and on this continent. The religious life of London is now being stirred as it has not been before for a generation by an American evangelist-Dr. Torrey-long associated with the late Dwight L. Moody in his evangelistic work and apparently possessing much of that famed evangelist's spiritual

Perhaps the most striking conformation that there is probably now be-ginning a tide of religious enthusiasm and inspiration in this country also is furnished by the Congregational Church. As one result of the week's meetings held last November in Plymouth Church, Brooklyn, by the noted lecturer, author and evangelist, Dr. Dawson, and the "mission with voice and pen" conducted in Brooklyn that week by Dr. Dawson and Dr. Hillis. pastor of Plymouth Church. Dr. Dawson has been invited by a committee of Congregational churches to engage in a four months' mission and tour of the churches of his denomina-tion in America. Dr. Dawson, in order to do this work, has resigned his London pastorate, and will enter upon what may prove to be a notable evang-elistic work in Canada. Whether there is to be a new and general revival of Christianity as a result of the movements noted it would be hazardous to predict, but the signs of the times certainly are favorable to that supposition.
