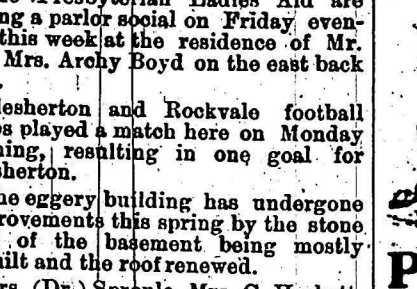
Charlie McFavish, who has been for some time in Toronto attending the British American Business College, received his diploma last week and has since been the subject of congratulations from his friends.
