An Excellent Concert.

Not a ray of disappointment appeared upon the faces of the large audience which attended the concert in the Markdale Methodist Church on Thanksgiving evening under the auspices of the Epworth League. The program was one of rare merit and was fully sustained throughout. The solos, duets, quartettes and the readings were all splendidly rendered and the performers were recalled after every number.
