By-Law No. 176

Of the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Markdale.

A By-Law to aid Armstrong Bros. in Establishing a Wagon Factory in the Village of Markdale.

WHEREAS Armstrong Bros. have applied to the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Markdale for aid by way of a loan to them of \$10,000, in accordance with the terms and subject to the conditions and stipulations mentioned in the certificate of the repayment of the said sum, as hereinafter set out, to enable them to establish and equip a modern wagon factory at Markdale;

AND WHEREAS it is deemed advisable and expedient to grant aid by way of loan of the said sum for the purposes hereinafter mentioned;

AND WHEREAS in order thereto, it will be necessary to create a debt of \$10,000 as hereinafter provided (which is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this by-law) the proceeds of which Debentures to be applied to the said purpose and the other:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to issue the said debentures at one time, and to make the principal of the same repayable by yearly sums during the period of ten years, being the currency of the said debentures, said yearly sums to be paid by the said Armstrong Bros. or their assigns, in accordance with the terms and conditions hereinafter set out, and interest shall be paid nearly as possible equal to the amount payable in each of the other nine years of the said period (as hereinafter provided);

AND WHEREAS the total amount required by the Municipal Act to be raised annually by special rates for the purpose of the said loan and interest, as hereinafter provided, is the sum of \$122,500;

AND WHEREAS the amount of the whole rateable property of the said Village of Markdale, according to the last revised assessment of the said Village of Markdale, is \$1,225,000;

AND WHEREAS the amount of the existing debenture debt of the said Municipality is \$60,000, part of the principal or interest is in arrears;

THEREFORE THE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL of the Village of Markdale doth hereby enact as follows:

(1) It shall and may be lawful for the Municipal Council of the Village of Markdale to borrow the sum of \$10,000 from the said Armstrong Bros. or their assigns, of the sum of \$10,000 to aid in the necessary additions to, and the equipping of, the factory premises now occupied by said Armstrong Bros. in order to convert same into a modern and well equipped wagon factory at Markdale, without the consent of the ratepayers of the said Village of Markdale, and to pay the same to the said Armstrong Bros. or their assigns, in accordance with the terms and conditions hereinafter set out between the said Armstrong Bros. and the Board of the said Village of Markdale, and to be secured by a first mortgage on the factory and plant of the said Armstrong Bros.

(2) The principal of the said loan, the last mentioned sum of \$10,000, debentures of the said Village of Markdale, in the amount of \$10,000 as aforesaid, in sums of not less than \$100 each shall be issued on the first day of July, 1905, each of which debentures shall be dated on the date of the issue thereof, and shall be payable by the said Village of Markdale, after, at the office of the Municipal Clerk of the said Village of Markdale.

(3) The said debentures shall be signed by the Mayor of the said Village of Markdale, and by the Treasurer thereof, and the Board of the said Village of Markdale, and shall be attested by the Municipal Clerk of the said Village of Markdale.

(4) The said debentures shall bear interest at the rate of four per centum per annum, payable yearly at the said bank at the first day of December in each and every year during the currency thereof, and shall have attached to them coupons for payment of the said interest, which coupons shall be signed by the Mayor of the said Village of Markdale.

(5) During the currency of the said debentures, the said Village of Markdale shall be liable for the said rate on all the rateable property in the said Village of Markdale, at the rate of one and one-half per centum per annum, for the purpose of paying the amount due in each of the years for principal and interest, in respect of the said debentures, as hereinafter provided.

(6) This By-law shall take effect on the day of its passing, and shall be subject to the approval of the Municipal Council of the Village of Markdale.
