Of the Municipal Corporation of the Village of Markdale.

A By-Law to aid Armstrong Bros. in Establishing a Wagon Factory in the Village of Markdale.

WHEREAS Armstrong Bros. have applied to the Municipal Council of the Corporation of the Village of Markdale for aid by way of a loan to them of \$10,000, in accordance with the terms and subject to the conditions and stipulations mentioned in an agreement for the repayment of the said sum, as hereinafter set out, to enable them to establish and equip a modern wagon factory, at Markdale. AND WHEREAS it is deemed advisable and expedient to grant aid by way of lean of the said sum of \$10,000 for the purposes hereinafter mentional.

AND WHEREAS in order thereto, it will be necessary to issue debentures of the said Village of Markdale for the sum of \$10,000 as hereinafter provided (which is the amount of the debt intended to be created by this by law) the proceeds of the said Debentures to be applied to the said purpose and to no other:

AND WHEREAS it is desirable to issue the said debentures at one time, and to make the principal of the said debt repayable by yearly sums during the period of ten years, being the ourrency of the said debtentures, said yearly sums being of such respective amounts that the aggregate amount payable in each year for principal and interest shall be as nearly as possible equal to the amount sp payable in each of the other nine years of the said period (as shown in schedule "A" hereto annexed.)

(2) For the purpose of raising the last mentioned sum of \$10,000, debentures of the said Village of Markdale to the amount of \$10,000 as aforesaid, in sums of not less than \$100 each chall be issued on the first day of July, 1900, each of which, debentures shall be dated on the date of the issue thereof, and shall be payable within the ten years thereafter, at the office of the Merchan's Bank of Canada, at the said Village of Markdale.
