Following the advance guard described in my last letter, the troops comprising the division ordered to the attack were the 3rd Buffs (British Infantry, 8th Punjanb Indiau Native Infantry, 44th Regiment (B. I ;) Rattan's Rocket Battery, Royal Marines, Madras Sappers and Miners, Right Wing 64th Regt. (B.L.) with reserve ammunition, hospital stretcher bearers, with rear guard made up from the above regiments terminating with cavalry and artillery. After a two days arduous march a balt was called, the muster roll of sharpshooters, or marksmen, as they were now designated, was called, among which was No. 3660 Lance Sergeant Henry Bird, 44th Regiment, who was put in command of the left subdivision of the 44th's quota, the right subdivision under the command of a subaltern, Lientenant Ingham The troops were at once set to work digging friches and throwing up earthworks. by a line of marksmen some distance to the front, each of us being provided. with pick and shovel and orders to dig rifle pits about twenty feet distant from each other, each man throwing the loose earth up in front of his little rifle pit to form a sind of breastwork as well as a rest for his rifle in taking a

As I have said, the night was very dark and the river had swollen to the level of its banks caused by the rolling sands of the river ged. The Chinese used flat-bottomed boats which glided so smoothly and noiselessly along the surface of the river, that, on so dark a night as the one in question, it was no difficult matter to elude the most vigilent sentinel, especially if the wind was not in the watcher's favor. NY even numbered Section of Domi ANY even numbered Section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchevan and Alberta, excepting 8 and 20, not reserved, nay he homesteaded by any person who is the sole fad of a family, or any male ever 18 years of ge, to the extent of one quarter section of 160 cres, more or less.

Butry must be made personally at the local and office for the district in which the land is

ituated.

The homesteader is required to perform the conditions connected therewith under one of the following plans:

(1) At least six months' residence upon and mativation of the land in each year for three lands.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is second) of the homesteader resides upon a arm in the vicinity of the land entere for. the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by such person residing with the father of

(3) If the settler has his permanent resilience ipon farming land owned by him in the vicing this homestead, the requirements as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the pid land.
